Wirral JSNA: Children & Young People Chapter Update (December 2012)

[We have added new birth information that shows a continued increase in the number of births in Wirral.](#) The figure for 2011 was the highest in the 13 years, with 3,802 live births in the borough. In contrast the general fertility rate in England and Wirral had been rising since 2002, but then showed a decrease in 2011. This may be due to the higher number of women (as revealed by 2011 Census)

Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2010: Update for Wirral

[This IMD update has been produced by NHS Wirral Performance & Public Health Intelligence Team to summarise the main aspects in the IMD 2010.](#)

The IMD is a measure of relative deprivation at a small area level. It is an important tool to identify disadvantaged areas so that policy makers can target limited resources where they are most needed, and this briefing summarises the main findings relevant to Wirral.

Wirral climate campaign generates over 6000 pollution reduction pledges

CRed Wirral is Wirral's community carbon reduction campaign. The campaign, supported by the Wirral Climate Change Group, has already attracted over 2000 people who together have made over 6000 carbon cutting pledges worth a potential reduction of 1100 tonnes of CO2 pollution. The campaign website www.credwirral.org.uk provides the main information hub where visitors can find out how to cut their CO2 emissions at home and work, and make and track their own carbon reduction pledges. Those signing up receive a quarterly e-bulletin.

An early Christmas present from Warmer Wirral

The Warmer Wirral team has a great gift for Wirral residents this Christmas - more funding for free insulation that could mean a warmer home this winter!

The scheme has received additional funding from British Gas, enabling Wirral residents to have insulation installed right up to February 2013.

While other discounted insulation schemes offered by utility companies are now closed to general applications, Wirral homeowners and private tenants can still get their home insulated for free. There is still time to have a survey before Christmas and the insulation can then be installed quickly and easily in January.
