

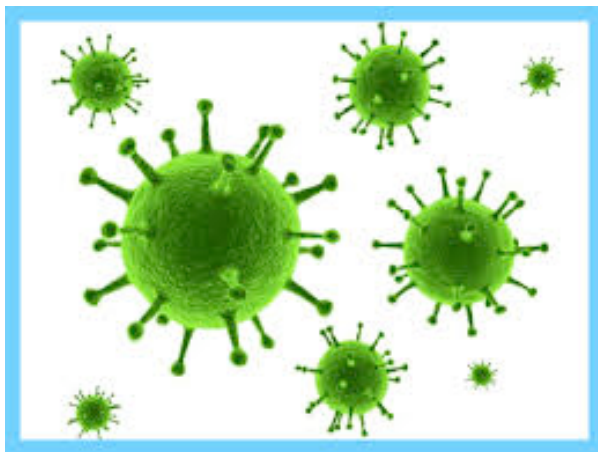

- The most common sexually transmitted infection in Wirral is Chlamydia. The rate of infection is higher than the average for England but lower than the average for the North West.



- We know about 169 people in Wirral who are living with HIV/Aids. But there will be also about 40 people who do not know that they have got it.



- The most common way to catch HIV/AIDS in Wirral is sex between a man and a woman.



● There is a higher rate of women under age 25 having more than one abortion in Wirral than the average for England and Wales



● More teenagers became pregnant in Wirral than the average for England in 2010. There has been fewer teenagers becoming pregnant in 2011.



● Very few young mothers in Wirral are in a job, training for a job, or in college or school.
